

## HLT51607 Diploma of Nursing

### ASSESSMENT STRATEGIES

Assessment is used to provide students with feedback on their progress and to evaluate their skills and knowledge against the training qualification and industry requirements. ### QUALIFICATIONS TO BE ISSUED

Upon completion of this course, successful learners will be issued with a Diploma of Nursing (HLT51607) and be eligible to apply for registration as an Enrolled Nurse with Nurses and Midwifery Board Australia.

A Statement of Attainment will be issued by IHNA for any unit of competency completed by the student even though the full qualification is not accomplished.

# HLT51607 Diploma of Nursing

IHNA has been approved to deliver HLT51607 Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled Nurse) accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Council (ANMAC) and the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA).

## AIM OF THE COURSE

This course provides essential skills and knowledge to work as an Enrolled Nurse in a variety of health care settings such as: acute care, chronic care, aged care, rehabilitation and mental health.

This course may also provide pathways into the Bachelor of Nursing (e.g. direct entry into Year 2) and other higher qualifications in health care.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicants must have completed Year 12 or equivalent, or be of mature age and pass a basic numeracy and literacy test.
2. Basic computer skills are desirable.
3. You will be required to apply for a National Police Record check.
4. You will need to show evidence of required immunisation / vaccination for clinical placement.

## THE COURSE IS SUITABLE FOR :

- ◆ People working in aged care/community care (with Cert III and IV)
- ◆ People working in hospitals (as PSAs)
- ◆ School leavers (who have completed Year 12 or equivalent)
- ◆ Mature learners with the appropriate experience and/or qualifications

Persons of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent are encouraged to apply. Applicants who consider that their capacity to apply under normal circumstances has been limited by some disadvantage (e.g. illness, disability, economic hardship, isolation or English language difficulties) may apply to be considered as a disadvantaged person.

## DURATION

3 semesters over 18 months (approximately 20 hours per week)

## REGISTRATION CRITERIA

The students have to meet the registration criteria of NMBA at the time of registration.

13. HLTEN513B	Implement and monitor nursing care for clients with chronic health problems
14. HLHIR404D	Work effectively with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
15. HLTOSH300B	Contribute to OHS processes
16. HLTEN516B	Apply understanding of the Australian health care system
17. HLTEN506B	Apply principles of wound management in the clinical environment

18. HLTEN505B	Contribute to the complex nursing care of clients
19. HLTEN507B	Administer and monitor medications in the work environment
20. HLTEN510B	Implement and monitor nursing care for consumers with mental health conditions
21. HLTEN512B	Implement and monitor nursing care for clients with acute health problems

1. HLTEN514B	Apply research skills within a contemporary health environment
2. HLTIN403C	Implement and monitor infection control policy and procedures
3. HLTEN519B	Administer and monitor intravenous medication in the nursing environment
